## Things to Consider When Applying at Backbone Valley Nursery

- Spring is our busiest season of the year. Therefore, no time off requests will be considered between February 1<sup>st</sup> and May 31<sup>st</sup>. This includes Spring Break, so don't even ask.
- Any other days taken off during this time will require a good excuse such as: my leg fell off or I have the Bubonic plague, and those must be verified by a doctor.
- Retail experience is a plus, merchandising is great, plant knowledge wins brownie points, but is not necessary.
- If you are anticipating being a cashier, expect to multi-task. You will have to water, stock chemicals, unload plants, load stuff, be pulled in several directions by customers, all while someone is asking you where the rest room is.
- If you are anticipating watering, expect to multi-task. You will have to stock chemicals, unload plants, load stuff, be pulled in several directions by customers, all while someone is asking you where the rest room is.
- We lift heavy stuff... all the time... every day... you must be able to left 20-50 lbs. This is for women and men applying.
- We are on our feet all day, if you want a sitting job, perhaps try telemarketing, or become a cab driver, both respectable professions... here, we stand.
- We are looking for people who are organized, dependable, thorough, detail oriented, and friendly. If you are not, go apply at Wal-Mart.
- We get very hot in the summer, there is no guarantee you will be in the air-conditioned store and whiners are not fun to be around. If you are hot, there is a good chance we are also hot, so stop reminding us.
- Take the previous, replace hot with cold, same goes for winter.
- There are bugs, snakes, bees, raccoons, skunks, and other wildlife on the property; there is a good chance you will come in contact with some of these things. They live here. Do not squish them. They would never come to your house and squish you.
- We sell plants. Some are pokey, itchy, sticky, poisonous, or just plant cumbersome to deal with. Just sayin'.

- Visitors are not allowed during work hours. It's great if you have a wife/husband/girl/boyfriend, but they don't
  work here and should not loiter on the property. Also, long periods of time should not be spent showing family
  members around. If you need to shop with them, come on your days off.
- Personal phone calls must be kept to a minimum. Let friends and family know that when you are at work you are working, and don't have time to be on the phone. Cell phones are not allowed while at work.
- No, you can't wear your headphones. No, you can't check your Facebook. No, you can't check your email. Do it on your lunch break or at home.
- Yes, breaks are allowed if you check in with someone first and do it at an appropriate time. One in the morning and one in the afternoon. The same goes for lunch.
- Tardiness is not tolerated here. If you think you will be late, save us the training time and go take a nap instead of filling out this form.
- Weekends (Saturday and Sunday) are not negotiable; all new hires must work weekends. We are open 7 days a week. Be prepared to rearrange your schedule.
- This job can sometimes be boring or tedious, but there is always something to work on, even during the slow periods. Employees are expected to keep busy.
- Nursery work is not like gardening. We sell plants and maintain them, but there is not much gardening on the property.
- This job is seasonal. When the season is over, some will be kept on if they show they deserve the job. The rest should be prepared for a job hunt.
